#### WELCOME



#### A YEAR OF MERCY WITH POPE FRANCIS

Jesus speaks only a word of forgiveness, not of condemnation; whenever anyone finds the courage to ask for this forgiveness, the Lord does not let such a petition go unheard.

#### PASTOR'S CORNER

#### A GOD OF SURPRISE!

On this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter, referred to as "Divine Mercy Sunday", there is much joy. In conjunction with the celebration of the Easter Season, the Church designated this day to canonize both Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II as saints.

These two great pontiffs were appointed at a time when they were both relatively unknown and came as a complete surprise. It was the feeling of the hierarchy of Rome, that it would be best to select and elderly cardinal as pope, thereby, giving extra time to select a more suitable successor. Little did the hierarchy know that God had special plans for this lovable and wise shepherd, who walked in the shoes of the fisherman for three short years (1960-1963). Pope John XXIII declared that there would be a Second Vatican Council in Rome, calling upon all the bishops of the world to attend. The Council would make some dramatic changes in liturgy, such as celebrating the Mass in the language of the people. He referred to the council as an "Opening up the windows" to let fresh air in and bring the Church up to date in meeting the needs of a fast pacing world.

Pope John Paul II was elected pope. A native of Poland; he was the first non Italian to be elected pope in over100 years. It captured the world by surprise. He was known as a pope who traveled all around the world and reached out to the youth. In 1995, the Holy Father visited Baltimore and celebrated Mass at the stadium. I remember when I received two tickets for parishioners to attend the Mass at Cathedral of Mary Our Queen before he embarked back to Rome. Mr. Barney Lubertine, President of the Holy Name and Mrs. Elizabeth Schroeder, president of the Sodality attended and had the honor of shaking hands with the Holy Father.

The world was surprised again when Pope Benedict XVI resigned in February 2013. What other surprises would take place? The surprise that the next Pope would come from the Western hemisphere, a Jesuit bishop from Agentina – Pope Francis. He has drawn attention by his reaching out to the poor and living a lifestyle of humility and simplicity. As we celebrate the Joy of Mercy this Easter Season, we continue to encounter God of Surprise in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.
